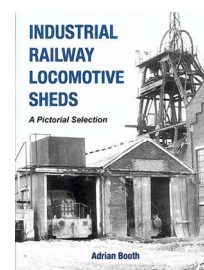
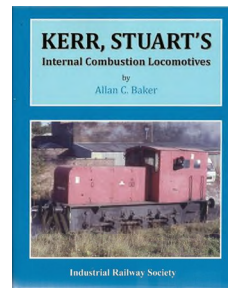

WHO ARE WE?

The **Industrial Railway Society** was founded in 1949 to specialise in the study of privately owned railways, their motive power and rolling stock. Initially this meant those railways serving private industry but over the years the heritage railway movement has developed so we now devote much effort to recording that, especially as so many heritage lines depend on former industrial locomotives for their motive power.

WHAT DO WE DO?

- We produce a bi-monthly **UK News Bulletin** covering current developments on industrial and heritage railways in the UK and Ireland, both as an A5 booklet summarising all the key news, available in printed and digital formats (suitable for viewing on your mobile), and in a larger (A4+) digital edition, in full colour and with more background detail, including maps, internet and video links, often drawing on the Society's seventy year archive to put current events in their historical context.
- Every quarter we produce an **Overseas News Bulletin** covering industrial and preserved railways throughout the rest of the world, and available in both printed and digital form.
- We also produce quarterly a well-researched and illustrated magazine, the **Industrial Railway Record**, featuring articles of historical interest on subjects seldom covered by the mainstream railway press but which represent an integral part of railway history. Printed in A5 format with 12 issues per volume, complete with index. Many of our members have their copies bound.
- We are active **publishers**. It all started back in the 1940s, with booklets listing the basic details of all known industrial locos, both past and present, in an area. As time progressed these pocket books became steadily more detailed, providing information on each site as well as the locos. Today they have evolved into impressive works of research, and for the past fifty years we have produced the definitive EL series, listing all known extant locos and railcars on industrial and heritage railways in the UK and Ireland; regular update lists are circulated to members with the Bulletins. We also produce books covering specific items of industrial railway interest. All these publications are available to members at discounted prices. We have a substantial archive and encourage members to participate in research.
- We also organise **visits** to industrial railways which are normally off-limits to the general public, providing an insight in to what, even today, still helps to keep the wheels of industry turning. Sometimes you even get to dress up for the occasion....

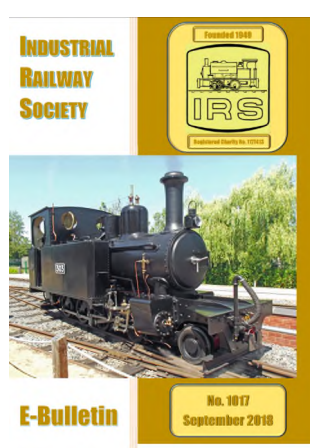
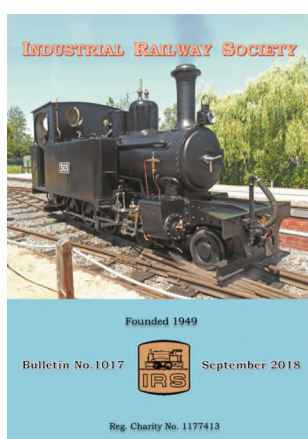
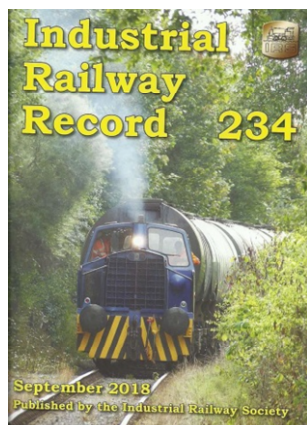
